INFLUENCE

Refugee community organisations (RCOs) influence policy and practice in London to reflect the needs of refugees and people seeking asylum

COLLECTIVE AND AMPLIFIED VOICE

RCOs have a collective and amplified voice and are driving the development of a shared understanding of the needs of refugees and asylum seekers amongst civil society, funders, the public sector and decision makers

Policy and decision makers are aware of the impact of their decisions and policies on refugee communities

Better informed and empowered refugee communities hold decision makers to account

Service providers, strategic planners and funders are aware of the real needs, gaps in service delivery and their impact on refugee communities

RCOs are able to contribute to and shape solutions on the basis of communities' needs

We facilitate collective action on the issues that matters most to refugees in London

We engage with policy and decision makers at all levels for the benefit of refugees

We provide evidence and insights on community issues and co-produce best solutions

We develop community leadership and build the capacity of forum members
